(3) Earn 4 credits or above from Elective Basic Course (excluding Internship I and II, and Field Work Project I and II).

(4) Earn 4 credits or above each from Elective Course and Seminar Course in Foundation Subject.

(5) Up to 4 credits earned from courses other than the ones in the table above can be used to fulfill graduation requirement.

(1) Earn 30 credits or above following the table above.

(2) The following courses are mandatory: Research Workshop for Economics I, II and III [3 credits]; Research Project for Economics I and II [3 credits]; Introductory Statistics, Introductory Macroeconomics, Intermediate Microeconomics and Japanese Economy [8 credits]; Microeconomics and Econometrics [4 credits]. Research Workshop I and II examine students' attainment level for the next semester.

(3) Earn 8 credits or above from Elective Course in Advanced Subject; Social Development, Public Economics, International Trade, International Finance and Policy, Health Economics and Economics of Development III.

(4) Up to 4 credits earned from courses offered in other than the ones in the table above can be used to fulfill graduation requirement.

(5) Field Work Project I and II are not counted as a part of graduation requirement. About Internship I and II, up to 2 credits can be used to fulfill graduation requirement.
